Studying Podiatry

In order to register as a podiatrist in the UK you will need to complete a BSc (Hons) degree programme.

As a podiatry student you will study lower limb anatomy, pharmacology, physiology and podiatric medicine. You will also cover specialist areas, including:

- **Musculoskeletal podiatry**
- **The development of foot health in children**
- **Sports injuries of the lower limb**
- **Gait assessment**
- **Orthotics**
- **Nail surgery**
- **Diabetes**
- **Arthritis and soft tissue conditions**
- **Vascular disease and tissue viability**
