Hannah is registered with BUPA and Aviva. Most insurance cash back schemes work with an HCPC registered Podiatrist but we suggest that you check first.



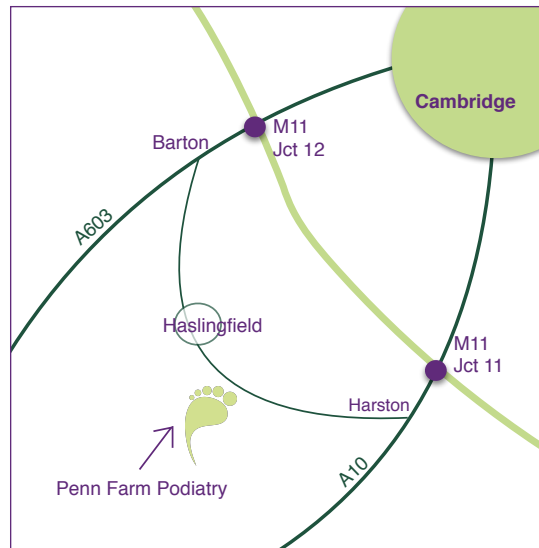
About Penn Farm Podiatry

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Fees and Services

Standard Consultation £43

20-30 minutes. These appointments cover almost anything foot related! Sometimes, if there is not enough time - for example if you need a biomechanical assessment, a follow up appointment will be booked to complete assessment and treatment.

Short Consultation £29

10 minutes. These brief appointments are booked by the podiatrist for some types of reviews.

Biomechanical Examination £75

45-60 minutes. An in-depth assessment of your foot mechanics, which can involve a gait analysis, muscle strength testing and assessing flexibility. Please bring with you any previous orthoses or insoles as well as any specific footwear - for example walking boots, sports footwear, dance or work shoes. You may be issued pre-fabricated orthoses, temporary orthoses or insoles, be cast for custom made devices or given footwear or exercise advice.

Fees and Services

New Patients £52

30-40 minutes. A new patient appointment can take a little bit longer than a standard consultation so that we can complete a thorough assessment.

Treatment is usually commenced at this first appointment. You may need a standard consultation to follow up or a biomechanical examination for further assessment.

You will be asked about your medical history. Please bring with you a list of medications.

Children and young people

Lots of children come to see podiatrists. While many of their problems are similar to the adult foot, they do also have their own range of unique issues. That said, not all young feet require treatment and after careful assessment we will discuss options and advise what is appropriate.

Steroid and joint injections

Hannah is qualified to administer corticosteroid and joint injections. These can be very helpful when conservative treatment, such as orthoses, haven't worked. Most commonly injections will be for a morton's neuroma, plantar fasciitis and hallux limitus.

What is a Podiatrist?

A Podiatrist is a highly skilled health professional who is trained to prevent, diagnose, treat and rehabilitate abnormalities of the feet and lower limbs.

We prevent and correct foot deformities, reduce pain, treat infections and keep people as active as possible.

What is the difference between a "chiropodist" and a "podiatrist"?

Well, technically they are the same thing and we are registered with the HCPC as Chiropodists/Podiatrists. Most countries no longer use the term "chiropodist", and the change in title reflects that our scope of practice extends beyond "just" corns and toenails (although we are still pretty good at that too).

Items for sale
